As the weather gets warmer, please remember our dress code:

*Shorts, pants, and skirts: Must be not shorter than two inches above the knee. We know with today's fashions, it's tough to find shorts that are longer. Capris are a great option for girls. Basketball shorts for boys and girls also work well.

*Shirts and tops must have straps that are at least 1 1/2" in width.

*Leggings need to be covered with a long shirt.

*Tight clothing must be covered with another loose layer that meets dress code standards.

*Hair should be of normal color tones with no drastic departure from one's natural hair color. It is to be kept out of eyes, and in a natural manner that does not distract from the educational process.
